

## Curriculum Committee Minutes

April 18, 2019

The committee met, reviewed, and discussed the following nineteen proposals and informational items. All items were recommended for approval as written EXCEPT items 14, 15, and 16 (the three new Topics in Literature courses and the request for them to be put forth to TBR as additions to General Education). There was a lot of discussion surrounding these three proposals in particular. The faculty felt that these courses would be great electives or honors courses, however they do not recommend them for General Education. In addition to the comments regarding these courses better serving as electives or honors, many faculty felt that the college already offers ample General Education courses in Literature/Humanities, since we currently have seven General Education Literature courses for students to choose from and do not see the need to add three more. A motion was made and seconded to recommend these three courses as electives/honors ONLY with 8 faculty voting with the motion, one faculty abstaining from the vote, and two proxy email votes that were in favor of the proposals as written.


FYI—changes to LS—reinstatement of math labs 0010, 0530; schedule set-up regarding ENGL 1010 with 0010 or 0899 co-req. labs ; co-req. enforcement regardless of placement scores (unless in a program that doesn't require college level mathematics or English course i.e. some programs and certificates)

1. Credit hour change: NUR 140 credit hour change from 10 to 9 (effective Summer 2019) [if approved, would supercede Feb. approval]
2. New Course: CRMJ 2367 Mental Health Aspects of Criminal Behavior, 3 CH, Pre-req.: PSYC 1030 Desc.: This course is a study of deviant behavior with emphasis on dealing with the mentally disturbed, sexual deviance, and drug addiction. It examines the roles of the psychologist in criminal justice cases.
3. Pre-req. change: COL 1030 current: ACT READ 19 proposed: ACT READ 15


4. Pre-req. change: CRMJ 2010 current: ACT READ 19, ENGL 18 proposed: none
5. Pre-req. change: CRMJ 1020 current: ACT READ 19, ENGL 18 proposed: none
6. Pre-req. change: CRMJ 2020 current: ACT READ 19, ENGL 18 proposed: none
7. Pre-req. change: CRMJ 1301 current: none proposed: ACT READ 19, ENGL 18
8. Pre-req. change: CRMJ 1340 current: none proposed: CRMJ 1010
9. New Course: MUS 1057 Music Theory I, 3 CH, Pre-req.: None Desc.: This course provides a study on music notation and harmony including major and minor scales, key signatures, triads, intervals, and rhythm. Students will learn to write four-part music, including primary chords in first inversion and cadences. This is a university-parallel course for students majoring in music.
10. New Course: MUS 1058 Ear Training I, 1 CH, Pre-req.: None Desc.: This course provides the student knowledge to sing and play notated music (both pitch and rhythm) as well as to notate music that the student hears (aural dictation). Melodies using the major and minor scale and intervals from the tonic and dominant triad will be studied. This is a university parallel course for students who plan to major in music.
11. New Course: MUS 1027 Class Piano I, 1 CH, Pre-req.: None Desc.: This course provides class lessons for beginning piano students. Instruction includes elementary technical exercises for developing keyboard facility and music reading. Playing positions, fingering, note identification, and reading beginning level rhythms are covered.
12. New Course: MUS 1207 Applied Voice I, 2 CH, Pre-req.: None Desc.: This course covers basic vocal technique to enhance the singing voice. Students will learn exercises, both physical and vocal, to create a strong vocal foundation. Students will be assigned a personal music portfolio of songs to learn and perform each semester. Singers will strengthen musicianship and stage performance skills to build confidence when singing and speaking in a group setting.

13. AST Program change: reduce the ACT score from 22 to 21 regarding the Praxis
  
14. New Course: ENGL 2130 Topics in American Literature, 3 CH, Pre-req.: ENGL 1010  
Desc.: This course is the study of representative works of American prose, poetry, and/or drama from the Colonial period through the twentieth century. *[note: if approved, CFA faculty would like to submit course to TBR for Gen. Ed. consideration—changes to Gen Ed can only be submitted in January—so, if approved by TBR, course would be Gen Ed effective Fall 2020]*
  
15. New Course: ENGL 2330 Topics in World Literature, 3 CH, Pre-req.: ENGL 1010  
Desc.: This course is the study of representative works of world literature from ancient times through the late twentieth century. *[note: if approved, CFA faculty would like to submit course to TBR for Gen. Ed. consideration—changes to Gen Ed can only be submitted in January—so, if approved by TBR, course would be Gen Ed effective Fall 2020]*
  
16. New Course: ENGL 2235 Topics in British Literature, 3 CH, Pre-req.: ENGL 1010  
Desc.: This course is the study of representative works of British prose, poetry, and/or drama from the Anglo-Saxon period through the twentieth century. *[note: if approved, CFA faculty would like to submit course to TBR for Gen. Ed. consideration—changes to Gen Ed can only be submitted in January—so, if approved by TBR, course would be Gen Ed effective Fall 2020]*
  
17. Delete course: NUR 190
  
18. Delete course: NUR 180
  
19. Course description change: HEC 231 Principles of Nutrition proposed: An introduction to macro and micro nutrients and their role in human nutrition, health and illness. Nutrient sources, digestion, absorption, storage, metabolism, deficiency and toxicity states are emphasized. Energy balance, caloric requirements, weight, physical activity, developmental and life cycle needs are studied. Consumer concerns regarding food and water safety and supply are also explored.
