• Case counts/Safety Protocols

Covid-19 numbers are going down across the country and community. We need to remain diligent with our safety protocols to ensure numbers stay down. We will continue to monitor case numbers in our service area.

• Athletics

The President's Athletic Council and Athletic Directors discussed spectators on campus for athletic events. The recommendation is that family members can attend. Family members are immediate household and will be required to complete campus Covid-19 screenings prior to events. For the baseball and softball games, bleachers will be blocked. Spectators must bring their own lawn chairs. For basketball games, social distancing and masks will be required.

• Operational Status

If numbers continue to improve over the next couple weeks, we can consider changing our operating status. The team discussed options to return approximately 1/3 of our student to campus with traditional face to face classes while maintaining a safe environment. The idea of embedding online/Zoom option to ground classes and alternating attendance days for students were also discussed. Some feel the FLEX and online options work best for students and will continue with that modality.

Distance Education is looking at a new software, Class for Zoom. JSCC would be earlier adopters. Their first step is to have demonstrations for faculty and the Pandemic Response Team. It has a high price point but are sole source. The product slide deck will be sent to Team members.

The Team discussed the need to look at current capacity for classrooms to determine which classes can be utilized and how best to keep down risk of exposure. A list of room sizes will be pulled and reviewed by appropriate staff. We need to have a plan for fall by spring break.

• Vaccination Site
