- JSCC will provide equitable education opportunities through multiple modalities that support academic and professional goals of our diverse community.
- JSCC is committed to improving the development and use of fiscal resources.

Completion:

- JSCC is committed to improving student retention and success.
- JSCC will identify and remove barriers to completion for students across demographic groupings.
- JSCC is committed to providing the supplemental academic support needed to enable all of our students to be successful.

Community and Workforce Development:

- JSCC will develop capacity in instruction to meet the increased needs necessitated by economic expansion in the college's 14-county service area.
- JSCC will improve community engagement by hosting open events on campus.

After wordsmithing by Dr. Esquivel and Dr. Mayo, the goals will be sent back to the committee for review. Once finalized, we will have a larger meeting with director level and above to gather input on goals and strategies. SGA and community partners will also have the opportunity to review as well.

As we move forward, not all departments will have a strategy under each goal. Also, do not let cost be a barrier for developing a strategy. The college will have to decide the priority on funding and will focus on strategies that help move the need the most toward achieving each goal.
