





#### **Cost of Attendance and Financial Aid**


Average Cost of Attendance per Year 2010-2011

# Average Amount of Financial Aid By Type 2009-2010








#### IPEDS "Student Right to Know" Graduation and Transfer-Out Rates Fall 2007 Cohort


#### Students Who Graduated or Transferred Out Within 150% of Normal Time to Completion
