2. Discussion Items:

• IR Director update

The new interim IR Director, Don Myers has accepted a 13 month temporary position. His first day will be April 15.

The process for the Dr. Allana Hamilton Memorial Scholarship is being finalized. Once we are ready for students to apply, and the JSCC Foundation is ready to receive donated funds, the information will be released.

• Steering Committee

• 7 and 7 Committee

This committee membership will be finalized by next Monday. There is a sense of urgency, but there's no due date for the committee's work. We want this to be thorough and correct; contacting other colleges who have implemented this already and how they did it will be an important aspect. The college's interest in a 7&7 schedule has been inspired by the work with Achieving the Dream and the success that some of our sister institutions in the ATD network have had with it.
